

# Terrell McKinney



Terrell McKinney is running for the Nebraska State Senate District 11 seat as a Democrat. He believes the state legislature “has a massive need for more young voices, especially from underserved communities.”

Born and raised in Omaha, McKinney left for college to attend Maryville University in St. Louis where he earned a bachelor’s degree in sport business management in 2014. He went on to earn his master’s degree in business administration from Midland University in 2018 and currently attends Creighton University School of Law.

He has also worked as a career specialist at Metro Community College and as a community organizer focusing on food insecurity and Medicaid expansion. McKinney’s top priorities include economic equity and opportunity, criminal justice reform, education, and ensuring Nebraska families have access to adequate and affordable healthcare. He also wants to work hard to bring resources and support to the juvenile justice system, establish affordable housing standards, as well as prioritize environmental issues with the understanding of how they affect Nebraska families and the local economy.
